



Hall of Liberation at Kelheim

Information for people with a handicap



Information for people with mobility impairment

Entrance:

- At the back of the Hall of Liberation without steps via a lift (length: 140 cm x width: 89 cm)
- Bell for wheelchair users at the entrance; door will be opened by staff
- A ramp for the threshold will be provided by staff if required.

Interior:

- Wheelchair users can visit the hall where the goddesses of victory stand. The two galleries and the viewing terrace can only be reached via long and very narrow spiral staircases.
- No steps
- Doorways at least 79 cm wide
- Level flooring
- Seats available



Disabled parking

- Three disabled parking spaces available
- Path from the car park to the ticket office approx. 50 m long (asphalt)
- Path from the car park to the Hall of Liberation approx. 400 m long (270 m asphalt, 130 m gravel surface)



Disabled toilets

- In the public toilet behind the Hall of Liberation (open)
- In the cash desk area (locked; key available at the cash desk)



Information for the visually impaired

- No guidance system for the visually impaired available. For blind or visually impaired visitors, an accompanying person is recommended.
- Audio guide available. A sighted companion is required when operating the guide.
- No regular guided tours



Information for the hearing impaired

- Induction loop for hearing aids available
- Written information available
